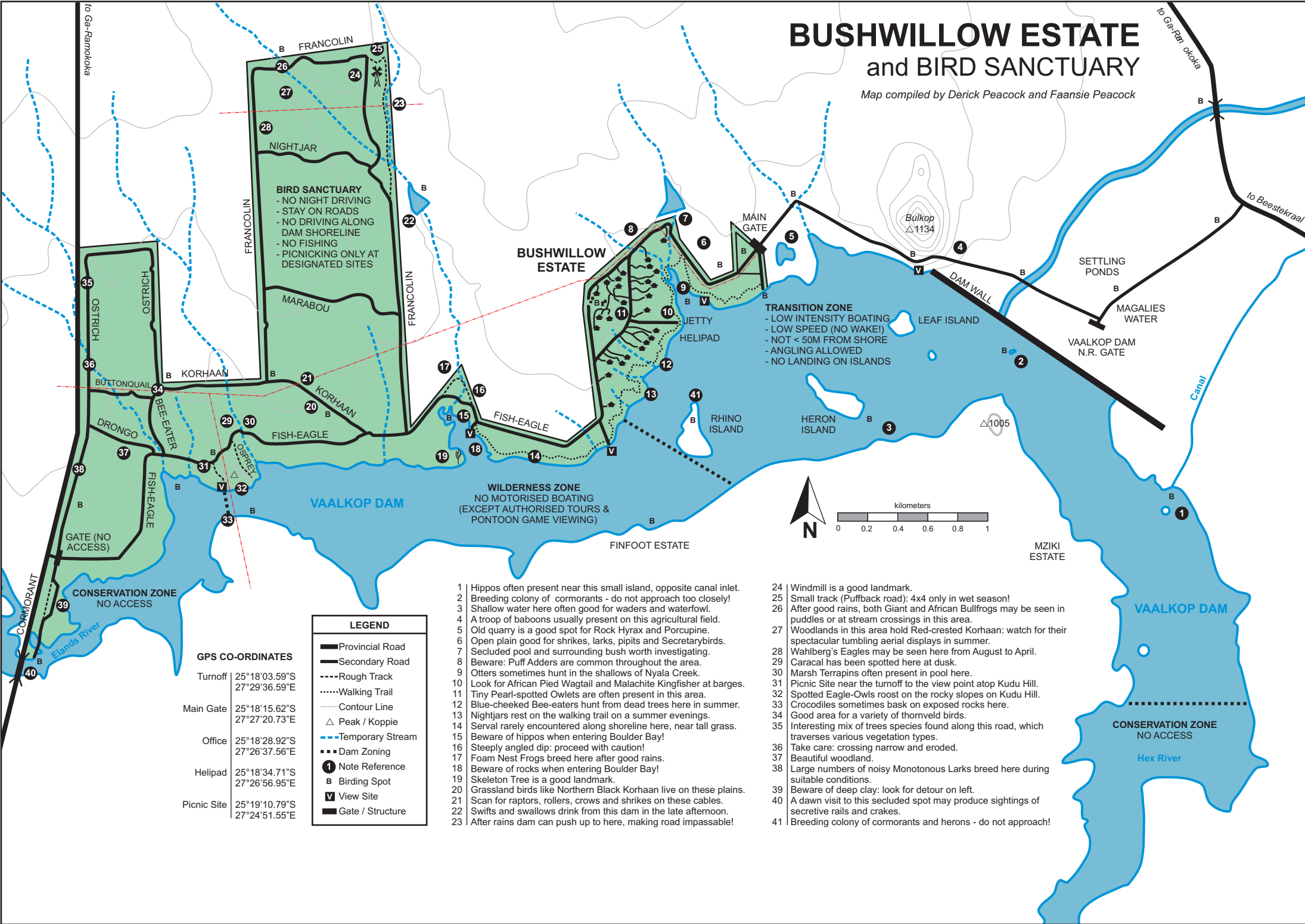


BUSHWILLOW ESTATE and BIRD SANCTUARY

- 1 Hippos often present near this small island, opposite canal inlet.
- 2 Breeding colony of cormorants - do not approach too closely!
- 3 Shallow water here often good for waders and waterfowl.
- 4 A troop of baboons usually present on this agricultural field.
- 5 Old quarry is a good spot for Rock Hyrax and Porcupine.
- 6 Open plain good for shrikes, larks, pipits and Secretarybirds.
- 7 Secluded pool and surrounding bush worth investigating.
- 8 Beware: Puff Adders are common throughout the area.
- 9 Otters sometimes hunt in the shallows of Nyala Creek.
- 10 Look for African Pied Wagtail and Malachite Kingfisher at barges.
- 11 Tiny Pearl-spotted Owlets are often present in this area.
- 12 Blue-cheeked Bee-eaters hunt from dead trees here in summer.
- 13 Nightjars rest on the walking trail on a summer evenings.
- 14 Serval rarely encountered along shoreline here, near tall grass.
- 15 Beware of hippos when entering Boulder Bay!
- 16 Steeply angled dip; proceed with caution!
- 17 Foam Nest Frogs breed here after good rains.
- 18 Beware of rocks when entering Boulder Bay!
- 19 Skeleton Tree is a good landmark.
- 20 Grassland birds like Northern Black Korhaan live on these plains.
- 21 Scan for raptors, rollers, crows and shrikes on these cables.
- 22 Swifts and swallows drink from this dam in the late afternoon.
- 23 After rains dam can push up to here, making road impassable!

- 24 Windmill is a good landmark.
- 25 Small track (Puffback road): 4x4 only in wet season!
- 26 After good rains, both Giant and African Bullfrogs may be seen in puddles or at stream crossings in this area.
- 27 Woodlands in this area hold Red-crested Korhaan: watch for their spectacular tumbling aerial displays in summer.
- 28 Wahlberg's Eagles may be seen here from August to April.
- 29 Caracal has been spotted here at dusk.
- 30 Marsh Terrapins often present in pool here.
- 31 Picnic Site near the turnoff to the view point atop Kudu Hill.
- 32 Spotted Eagle-Owls roost on the rocky slopes on Kudu Hill.
- 33 Crocodiles sometimes bask on exposed rocks here.
- 34 Good area for a variety of thornveld birds.
- 35 Interesting mix of trees species found along this road, which traverses various vegetation types.
- 36 Take care: crossing narrow and eroded.
- 37 Beautiful woodland.
- 38 Large numbers of noisy Monotonous Larks breed here during suitable conditions.
- 39 Beware of deep clay: look for detour on left.
- 40 A dawn visit to this secluded spot may produce sightings of secretive rails and crakes.
- 41 Breeding colony of cormorants and herons - do not approach!
